The Role of a Sponsor Teacher

A Mentor

- to assist in the selection of the project which best displays the student's skills
- to help establish appropriate time lines and valid objectives

A Guide

- to point out potential pit falls and problem areas
- to monitor the quality of the project

A Cheer Leader

- to encourage progress when times are tough
- to motivate and to keep the student on task

A Taskmaster

- to ensure time lines are met by inspecting the project
- to keep long range goals in mind
- to ensure objectives are met

Showcase Day

- to provide moral support in preparations
- to help ensure preparations are completed on time
- to check with your student during the day to see how things are progressing

The applicant's project must meet ALL of the following criteria (Please complete the following checklist)

- The completed project must be career / leisure oriented and must demonstrate specific skills in any of the following areas:
1. **Fine Arts** (Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music, etc.)
 2. **Applied Design, Skills & Technologies** (Business Ed., Technology Ed., Home Economics, Information Communication Technology)
 3. **Physical Activity** (Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics. A project that spans a 1-year period and that is beyond the scope of the physical education class or participation in extracurricular or community level activities)
 4. **International Languages (including Aboriginal Languages)** with IRPs or External Assessments, including AP and IB (must be a creative, practical application of the language and must be an original piece of work)
 5. **Community Service** (Volunteer activity, which includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues)
 6. **Indigenous Languages & Culture** (demonstrated at school or in the community)
- Candidate must meet all graduation requirements.
- Candidate must be a Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant.
- Candidate must work with a sponsor teacher (**Refer to role of a Sponsor Teacher**)
- The project must be presented for display and judging on a specified day.
- Student must be registered in a minimum of 6 courses overall with at least one course in grade 11 or 12 being similar to their project. (Attach copy of student timetable to this form)
(ie: A student presenting a drama related project must be registered in or have completed a Drama 11 or 12 course.)
- Performances (drama, music, readings etc.) will take place at a designated host venue. They will be no longer than 10 minutes in duration, with 5 minutes to strike and take down.
- A copy of the completed application form must be handed in to the school by the due date.
- Students must be in good standing with their school.
- International students can apply with the same criteria but will be recognized by the International Department.
