"The trip was not the most important part of the community that we built, but the sense of longing for a desire concerning request to long for

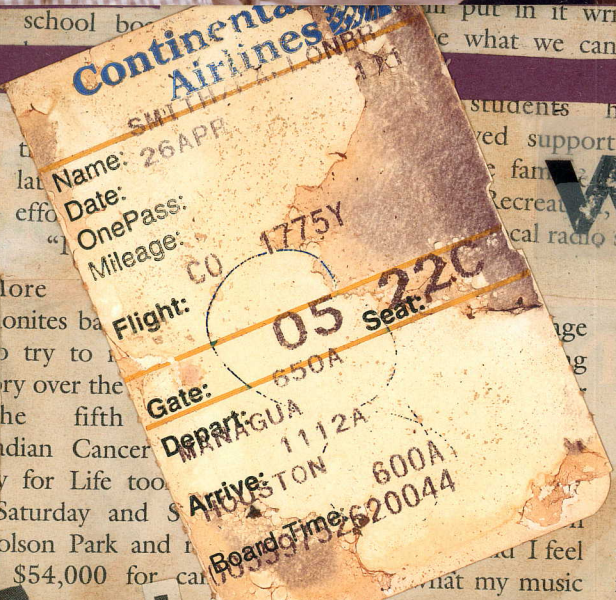
