



## Post-Secondary Student Funding – Quick Reference

The following information is provided as a starting point for research into available funding sources for Aboriginal post-secondary students.

**INAC Post-Secondary Student Support Program (PSSSP)** – contact your Band to inquire as to eligibility requirements, funding availability and application process.

**Student Loans** are available from the federal and provincial governments. In many cases, students who qualify for loans also qualify for special grants or bursaries (which do not need to be paid back).

Contact the student, financial or Aboriginal advisor(s) at the institution you plan to attend in order to receive updated and detailed information on funding sources, including those specific to the school.

Many school websites (eg. UBC, Langara, SFU, UVic) also provide scholarship and bursary information online (including bursaries and awards available to Aboriginal students in general, not just those attending their institutions).

**Ensure you apply for all scholarships, bursaries etc. that apply to your program or personal situation, not just those for Aboriginal students!**
