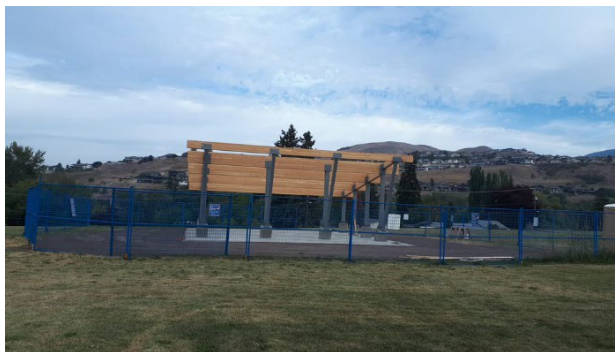


Kidston Elementary...

The kids are also hard at work already in our local stream as they went on a science field trip for Jennifer Bitz's STEM class in grade 8:

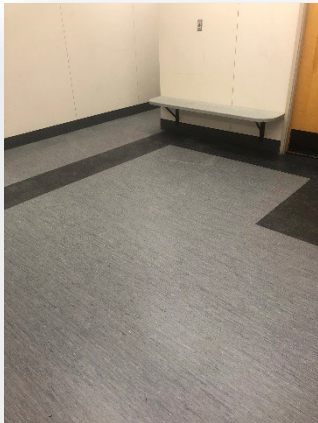

- Our new floors in the girls' changing room look fabulous!



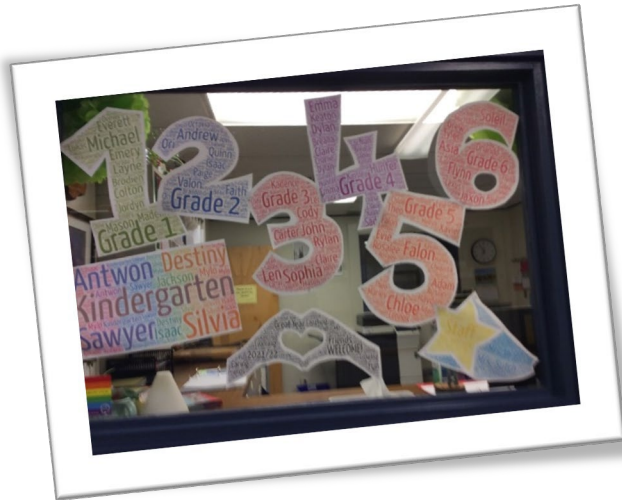
The new volleyball PE class is a huge success! Thanks Mr. Romain.

Indigenous Programs

The Indigenous Education team has arranged for two Legacy of Hope exhibits to be featured in SD22. The first exhibit is a traveling exhibit and is entitled, *Where are the Children? Healing the Legacy of the Residential Schools*. **Each secondary school** in the district will be host to the Legacy of Hope exhibit throughout the fall and winter, so that SD22 staff and students can learn about 125 years of the Indian Residential School system.



Indigenous Programs...

The Indigenous Education team has arranged to display a second interactive exhibit, ***Remembering, Honouring and the Way Forward*** at **VSS**. This piece was developed to: “...acknowledge the dark chapter in Canada’s history, to remember the Survivors who made it out of the Schools, and to honour those who did not, so that we can learn, change, take action and build respectful relationships between Canadians and Indigenous Peoples moving forward.”



- We also welcome new members to our department: **Dave Lafontaine** as the District Vice Principal and **Sheryl Newton** as Indigenous Education Lead Teacher.



Human Resources

- 42 new teachers hired to the district either as a TTOC or contract teacher for this school year.
- 59 support staff hired to the district this school year. This number includes 38 Educational Assistants.
- Over 100 new employees, including exempt staff, attended our voluntary virtual new employee orientation on September 2nd.
- Looking forward to local teacher collective agreement bargaining this fall and CUPE collective agreement bargaining this spring.

Student Learning Curriculum

Our Learning Directions Team has grown with an addition of another Technology Innovation Coordinator and Literacy Intervention Teacher. They are all excited about the year ahead and have been collaborating and planning professional learning opportunities. The Learning Directions Team is really looking forward to getting into schools to engage and support both students and teachers. They will be bringing:

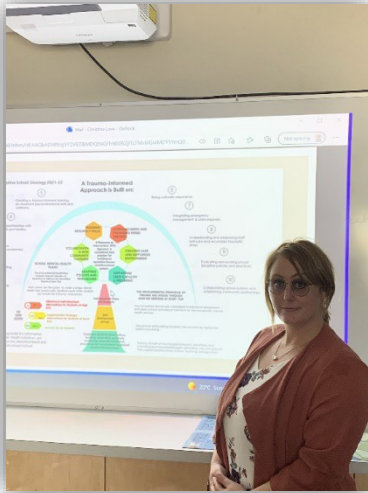
Career Programs

- We have a number of students that have taken advantage of our strong partnership with Okanagan College and have begun their learning in August/September:
 - Explore Trades Sampler – Experience with five different trades building up the base skills.
 - Academic Dual Credit – 1st year university level academic courses.
 - Plumbing Foundations
 - Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Mechanic
 - Certificate Programs – Nursing Unit Assistant, Education Assistant, Health Care Assistant.
- Many of our students have been working hard over the summer and have collected work experience credits to count towards their graduation. There are many more opportunities for students to plan for their future in the coming months.



Student Support Service

We have been spreading the word about moving forward in SD 22 using a Trauma Informed Approach to supporting students and staff. Kristen Zuest our Mental Health and Healthy Promoting Schools Liaison has presented about district wide initiatives that are available to all schools.



Our Inclusion Support Team is busy preparing community life skills activities that will be available to our students with diverse needs. Adapted aquatics begins again soon.



Student Support Service...

In Student Support Services we have brought various groups together for staff meetings to collaborate and plan for the upcoming school yr.



International

- Has welcomed 212 international students representing 14 countries for September 2021. We are still waiting for an additional 24 students to arrive. These students have been delayed due to a backlog in visa processing times.
- Feedback from our international students has been very positive. Our students are feeling welcomed in their schools and are finding the class topics interesting and are enjoying the change in teaching style.

- Charles Bloom Secondary School has welcomed 17 students into their program this fall, which is the largest group of International students in many years.



Finance Department

- Many families will not have to hunt for their lost cheque books this year. Most student fees can now be paid online with a credit card through the MyEdBC portal. Transportation fees can be paid through School Cash Online.
- The School District spent over \$107 million last school year towards its mission to inspire and develop lifelong learners who can communicate, think creatively, problem-solve, collaborate, and understand their personal and social responsibilities. The annual financial statements will be presented to the Board next week.
- In addition, the School District invested \$15.5 million last school year in our capital infrastructure, including school renovations, additions, and school technology.

Over the course of five days, teachers will share videos created by Indigenous storytellers, which show traditional ceremonies and artistic performances, alongside conversations with Elders and knowledge keepers, survivors, and children of survivors of residential schools. There will also be a moving tribute to the missing children that never returned home from the residential schools. On September 30, Orange Shirt Day, a special program will be held to commemorate the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.
