The K-12 Student Reporting Policy Framework ("the framework") is the result of extensive consultation and engagement with the education sector, including rightsholders, partners, teachers, parents, caregivers, students, and the public. The framework provides an overview of the upcoming changes to the Student Reporting Policy, set to be implemented in the 2023/24 school year.

#### What's new:

- Student reporting practices that align with B.C.'s curriculum and provincial assessment system
- Ensuring timely and responsive feedback on student learning that parents can understand
- Provincial Proficiency Scale at Grades K-9
- Graduation status update at Grades 10-12
- Student self-assessment and goal setting in all grades in the 3 written reports
- Changing the "I" reporting symbol to "IE" to denote "insufficient evidence" of learning instead of "incomplete" learning
- All learners, including students with a disability or diverse ability, will receive regular communications of student learning in the same way as their peers in any other program

#### What's the same:

- 5 communications of student learning; 3 written and 2 of flexible format
- Written descriptive feedback to accompany scale or letter grade/percentage
- Letter grades and percentages at Grades 10-12

<u>UBCO WWEST iSTAND STEM</u> Camps were full for our district and ran from Jan 3-6 at Fulton Secondary. Students from across the district in grades K-7 learned about a different STEM theme each day and reported having a great experience in the camp.

<u>Centre for the Arts and Technology Digital Bootcamp Grade 12</u> students and recent high school graduates are invited to attend four days of in-person, hands-on fun and exploration of the post-secondary programs from March 20th – 23rd, 2023. Digital Bootcamp is the best way to know that a future in arts and technology is right for you. Interested students are to connect with their Computer Lab teachers.

Education Policy Advisory Committee (EPAC) – the first meeting of EPAC will be held on Tuesday. January 31<sup>st</sup> at 3:30 pm. The meeting will be led by Anne Cooper who has been contracted to review and update all District policies. The meeting will include representatives from: the Board of Education, Superintendent of Schools or designate; Secretary Treasurer or designate; Principal or Vice-Principal Association (PVPA); Vernon Teachers' Association (VTA) (1); Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 5523 (CUPE) (1); District Parent Advisory Council (DPA) (1); Métis Association Representative (1); Okanagan Indian Band (OKIB) (1); Other district staff and or community members may attend where policies related to their positions are being discussed. The purpose of the Education Policy Advisory Committee is to assist the Board in policy development and policy revision by providing advice to the Board regarding educational policies in the areas of students, instruction, and community relations.

First Nations Education Steering Committee Conference (FNESC) - The conference theme, Resilience and Self-Determination: A Vision of the Future, challenged us to reflect upon the history of First Nations education in BC and to learn about the consistent efforts of First Nations to exercise First Nations Control of First Nations Education. At the conference this year, we celebrated the first four First Nations – ?aq'am, Cowichan Tribes, Seabird Island and Lil'wat Nation – who fully implemented their education jurisdiction, with law making authority. We also shared information about the new Indigenous-focused graduation requirement, which will ensure that all secondary school students graduate with knowledge of Indigenous cultures and perspectives. While it will be mandatory next year, we are pleased to say that School District 22 is ahead by implementing as many courses as possible this calendar year. Some BAA courses and others are forthcoming to the Board of Education. To support understanding of students, parents and staff about the Indigenous Focused Course Graduation Requirement, please review the attached links in this brochure and video in advance of course selection.

**Local Education Agreement (LEA) Celebration** – The Board of Education is looking forward to celebrating the signing of our Local Education Agreement with Chief and Council from OKIB on January 31<sup>st</sup>.

The finishing touches are being done for the Winter concert. The theme this year is "The Gifts of Winter".




### **Vernon Secondary School**

We invited our school community in for our Christmas Concert on December 8th. We had a full gym for both shows. The performances did not disappoint!












### **Kalamalka Secondary**




### **Information Technology Department**

IT Department: January 2023 Report	
Help Desk Activity	Over the past quarter, the IT Team has responded to approximately 1,725 helpdesk tickets
Phone Call Activity	In addition to help desk tickets, the IT Team has responded to over <b>2,500 support related phone calls</b> during the same time period
Chromebook Refurbishing	The department has refurbished 400+ of the 600 Chromebooks removed / refreshed in schools during the summer. 80 of these devices have been gifted to families in need during the month of October.
	There is still 200+ refurbished Chromebooks currently available for families in need. These devices can be provided free of charge but with support no longer available from Google, or from the district. Contact the helpdesk for more information.
VSS Refresh	The last of the Windows 7 devices are currently being replaced at VSS with desktops and laptops. 45 laptops and desktops have been refreshed during the month of November & December
Self-Serve Password	The IT team is currently working on implementing self-serve password services for students (employees will be next). This is a modern solution which will allow system users to manage, reset, and change their own passwords.
New Wireless Deployment	The wireless refresh project is underway. Delivery of the first shipment of switches and Access Points is expected later in December or early January 2023.  The Team has reviewed both Seaton and Kidston and expect to
Adobe Licensing	start deploying switches and Access Points in March 2023.  The Team will be upgrading Adobe licensing for both employees and students over the winter break.
