We are proud to live, work, learn, and play on the ancestral, unceded territory of the Syilx Nation.

**Welcome Back!** We welcome everyone back and wish you all a wonderful year of learning. Startup has been amazing with record turnouts at all our school events. Thank you all for your support as we navigate September class configurations and get everyone settled.

**Affordability Fund** – our district received \$925,000 to go toward food security and fees. The district has identified four main areas and put it out to our staff and families for further input as we wanted to hear their priorities as well.

- **Food & Inclusion Programs** (Brown bag lunch program, top up to starfish back-pack program, fees for inclusion activities)
- **Regular school base for all students** (School activity fees eg: field trips, instrumental programs, athletic programs, cultural events, shop fees)
- Regular school vulnerability (Breakfast programs, hot lunch program (eg: pizza Friday) for vulnerable students, life skills cooking programs)
- Alternate school vulnerability (For alternate programs: Crossroads, ALP, Open door) and other suggested possibilities.

**BX Traffic** – Thank you to all our parents who have been incredibly patient dealing with the traffic changes in the BX Elementary area during start-up. Your patience and support have helped things go very smoothly for our students.

**Changemaker Account:** Throughout the 2022-2023 school year, we have partnered with Jim Pattison Media (Beach Radio) to offer an opportunity for community to nominate youth Changemakers. At the end of the year, one lucky student will be honoured with a \$1000 scholarship. **Early Learning and Child Care (ELCC).** We have received \$175,000 to fund and establish a District Lead ELCC position who will:

- Lead and support ELCC school district projects and initiatives
- Complete and/or support the completion of an environmental scan of existing ELCC on school grounds
- Identify and align district resources to support ELCC
- Coordinate existing or new ELCC initiatives alongside early learning staff and/or team
- Maintain a focus on high-quality early learning and childcare experiences
- Engage across the district and liaise with partners and Ministry staff
- Identify opportunities for and expand access to ELCC on school grounds

Our District Lead for Early Learning and Child Care is **Jennifer Friesen** with support from **Kim Erven-Culler**.

#### **Enrollment and Staffing Updates from Human Resources:**

#### **Teaching**

- 424 teacher postings since the start of staffing season in late spring
- 59 of these postings have been since August 15
- 31 teachers hired to the TTOC list in early summer
- TTOC recruitment continues in September with a new TTOC posting
- Current struggle is filling a continuing 1.0 District Psychologist vacancy

#### **Support Staff**

- 247 support staff postings since later spring
- 15 new education assistant positions added for this school year
- 4 new student supervisor positions added for this school year
- 2 new clerical positions added for this school year

**Policy** – We are pleased to announce that the first phase of the Policy Review (Section 100) has been completed and posted on our website.

**Premier's Awards:** We are thrilled to acknowledge the following nominees: **Tom Craik, Corrine McWhinney, Josh Vance,** and **Tim Agnew** for the 2022 Premier's Awards. The Premier's Awards ceremony is an annual celebration of the finest examples of innovation and excellence in the BC Public Service. This provincial recognition is awarded to the most outstanding projects, teams, or individuals in the public service showcasing distinguished examples of professionalism, innovation, and collaboration. Ceremonies and the announcement of the winners in each category will be announced in October. We are proud of all of you.

**Secret Path** – *Secret Path* by Gord Downie and Jeff Lemire is being shown at the Towne Theatre in a few weeks already has 1646 students registered! Reconciliation in action. Secret Path tells the true story of Chanie Wenjack, a young boy who died on October 22, 1966, walking the railroad tracks, trying to escape from the Cecilia Jeffrey Indian Residential School to walk home.

**Spirit North Program** – Sky Richard, is a community Program Leader at Spirit North and will be working with the Indigenous youth in the Okanagan Indian Band community. Sky will be collaborating with Alexis Park to create land-based programs that allow opportunities for the OKIB student to build confidence and leadership skills.

Spirit North is a national charitable organization that uses land-based activities to improve the health and wellbeing of our Indigenous youth by empowering them in sports, school, and life. Our goal is to allow our participants to learn important lessons and discover their potential while building their confidence and courage to overcome the hardship Indigenous youth often face.

We acknowledge the importance of having a meaningful connection with the land. By allowing regular access to sports and land-based activities, we can improve the physical health, mental health, and community health of our Indigenous youth.

Working in partnership with the schools and communities, our active, participation-based programs create an environment that allows opportunities for Indigenous youth to feel unstoppable, develop skills that improve their performance in the classroom and deepen their connection to their communities. <a href="https://www.spiritnorthxc.ca/">https://www.spiritnorthxc.ca/</a>

**Thank you:** A special thank you to teachers **Genevieve Haiworonsky** and **Christine Molaison** who had to move their classrooms overnight from Alexis Park to Beairsto Elementary due to increased registrations. Thank you to our Director of Facilities, **Archie Stogianos**, and his entire team for providing moving, packing, and transportation assistance.

A HUGE thank you to Facilities and Maintenance teams – well done! The following work was completed over the summer:

- 8 childcare modules are in the final stages for: Ellison, Alexis Park, Mission, and Harwood schools
- 3 classroom portables have been added 2 for Seaton, 1 for Alexis Park
- Hillview/Lavington Lighting upgrades have been completed with an expected <u>CO Reduction of 16 tons per year</u>
- DDC system (to monitor HVAC) upgrade is underway at Alexis Park and Hillview with an expected CO2 reduction of 18 tons per year
- Phase 1 of Bloom upgrade is completed (HVAC) phase 2 is underway with an expected <u>CO2</u> reduction 30+ tons per year when project complete
- Hallway flooring has been replaced at BX and Lavington
- Learning Commons has been completed at Seaton Secondary School
- Irrigation Replacement has been completed at Mission Hill
- Mission Hill bathroom renovation has been completed
- Mission Hill exterior has been painted
- Mission Hill gym floor has been completed (first time in over 40 years!)
- Preparation of the Whitevale school gym for Gymnastics Club rental for the year has been completed
- We have discovered, removed, and remediated buried fuel tank at BX (!)
- vLearn has been relocated to Fulton and renovated with gender neutral washrooms
- And, every single venue is sparkling, ready for the return of little feet, medium-sized, and growing feet.

**Thank you** – final one for this report – **Transportation** – the first people our students see is their bus drive. A huge thank you to the folk, under the direction of **Tracey Syrota**, who worked long hours over the summer detailing the busses and to all our mechanics and drivers for having them ready to go on day one.

... and teachers showed off their rhythmic athletic skills at the first assembly led by Mrs. Quiring.
























### **Okanagan Landing**






Dual Credit Career Programs have started up at Okanagan College and are off to a great start including:

iPad Refresh	The department replaced and redeployed over 150 iPads in various schools around the district. This process will continue as schools developed their school-based tech plans.	
Data Integration: SeeSaw & Spaces	The district is implementing new software to assist with communicating student learning (CSL). The outgoing platform (Freshgrade) has been replaced with SeeSaw and Spaces. Over the
