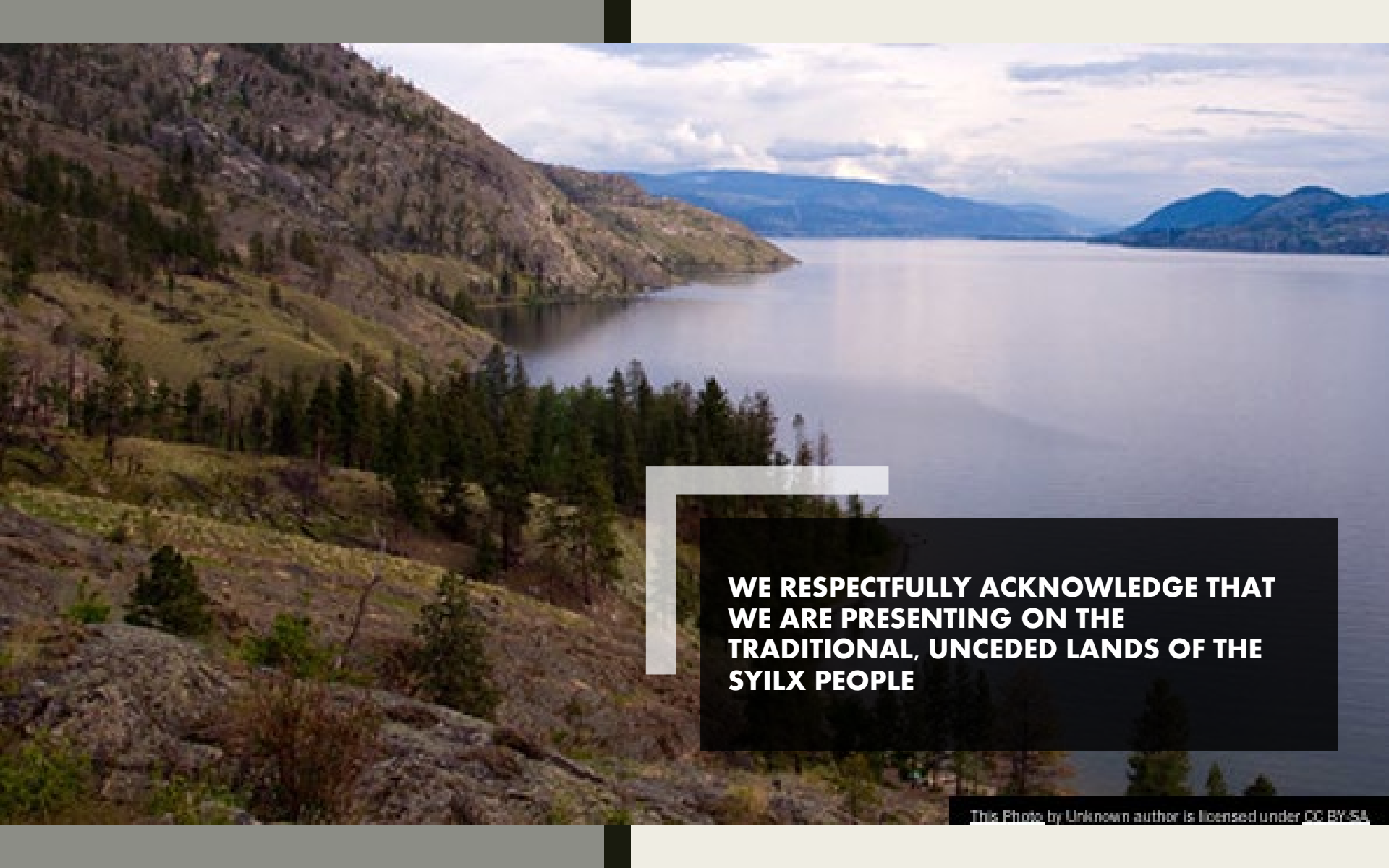

DUAL CREDIT Trades & Certificates

Dual Credit

Dual Credit students are enrolled in college programs during Grade 12 and receive **both** high school and college credits.

Students attend school at the college with college instructors - Vernon, Kelowna, Salmon Arm, Penticton or Kamloops depending on the program and the start date.

The district pays the student's entire tuition for the Foundation program. (Tuition Scholarship \$2500-\$8000 depending on the program)

Students are responsible for the college's extra fees: textbooks, personal protective equip., tools, deposits etc. (can vary from \$200- \$2500 depending on the program)

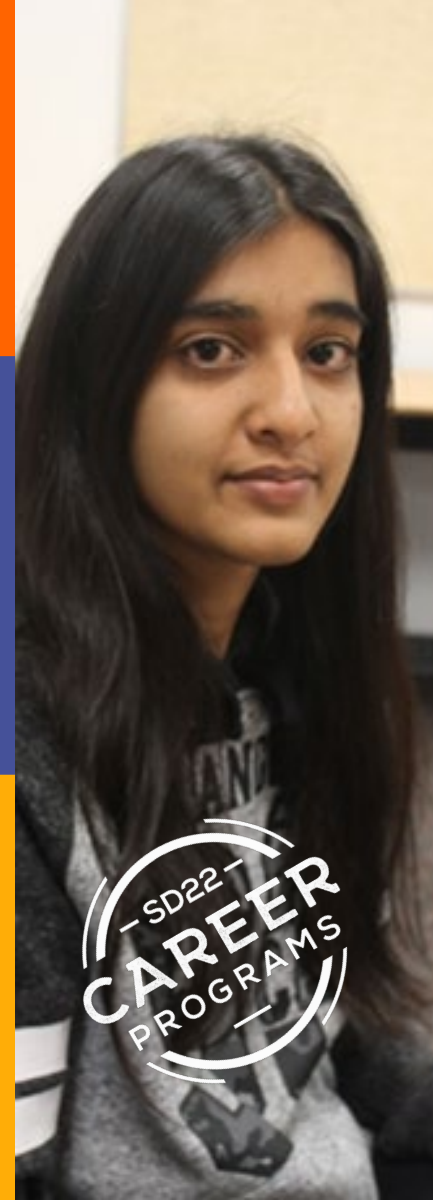

Dual Credit Certificate Programs

Early Childhood Educator Program

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

The first years of a child's education are among the most important. During this time educators can have a profound impact on a child's success in development – is being an early childhood educator the career for you?

School District 22 will pay tuition for the first year of the Early Childhood Education (ECE) Diploma program.

**** Please note SD#22 pays the first year of the tuition but DOES NOT PAY any portion of the tuition and/or fees for the second year of the ECE Diploma Program, all tuition and fees would be the responsibility of the student.**



After the first year of the ECE Diploma Program, there are three pathways to further your education:

Pathway One	Pathway Two	Pathway Three
After your first year of the ECE Diploma program (tuition only paid for by SD22) you qualify to apply to the BC Ministry of Children and Family Development to receive a Early Childhood Education Assistant Certificate.	You can further your education after your first year of the program by completing one more semester of the second year of the ECE Diploma Program. This is not paid for by SD22 and the cost is the responsibility of the Student. After completion you would qualify to apply to the BC Ministry of Children and Family Development to receive a Early Childhood Education Certificate.	Your third option is to complete the full second year of the ECE Diploma program and receive your Early Childhood Education Diploma. The second year of the ECE Diploma program is not paid for by SD22 and the cost is responsibility of the student.



When can I take these programs?

When?

Criteria

Under the age of 19 the school year that you start.
Program must be started while in high school.

*Start working with your Career Coordinator in
Grade 9 and/or 10*

Two options of when to start

- Grade 12 – preferred
- Grade 11 – under exceptional circumstances

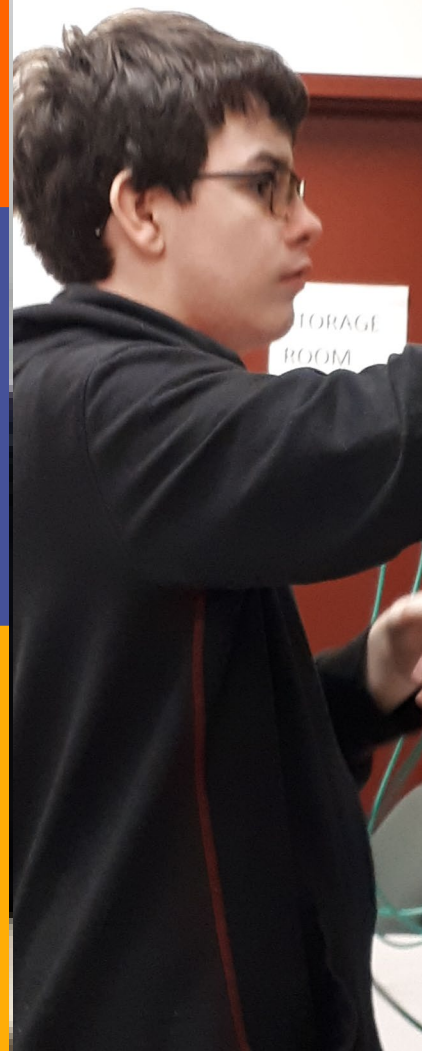

DUAL CREDIT Academic

ACADEMIC Dual Credit

Grade 12 students have the opportunity to earn **university-transfer credits** and **secondary school graduation credits** at the same time for the following ACADEMIC college classes. *See next slide*

These courses will be available to high school students to take in the **late afternoon or evenings** in either the **fall or winter** terms and are **transferable to universities and colleges**.

The tuition is sponsored by School District #22.*
Student fees, books etc are the responsibility of the student.

WORK IN TRADES Apprenticeships

WORK in Trades

What is '**WORK**' in Trades?

WORK lets students begin the work-based training component of an apprenticeship program while still in high school.

Students '**earn while they learn**' getting dual credits toward both their high school diploma and apprenticeship on-the-job training.

WORK provides a smoother transition from school to work and a quicker route to trade certification and a paycheck.



WORK in TRADES



How does it work?

Secondary School Apprentices are on the job with a sponsor employer as a registered youth apprentice.

WORK students complete **480 hours** of work experience that counts toward their apprenticeship and **16 graduation credits**.

To be eligible for **WORK**, students must be attending high school and under the age of 20 at program completion and finish the program within three months after graduation.

Youth apprentices in this program must, like other apprentices, **start by getting a job**. This means they must find an employer who will hire them as an apprentice and commit to their training as a sponsor.

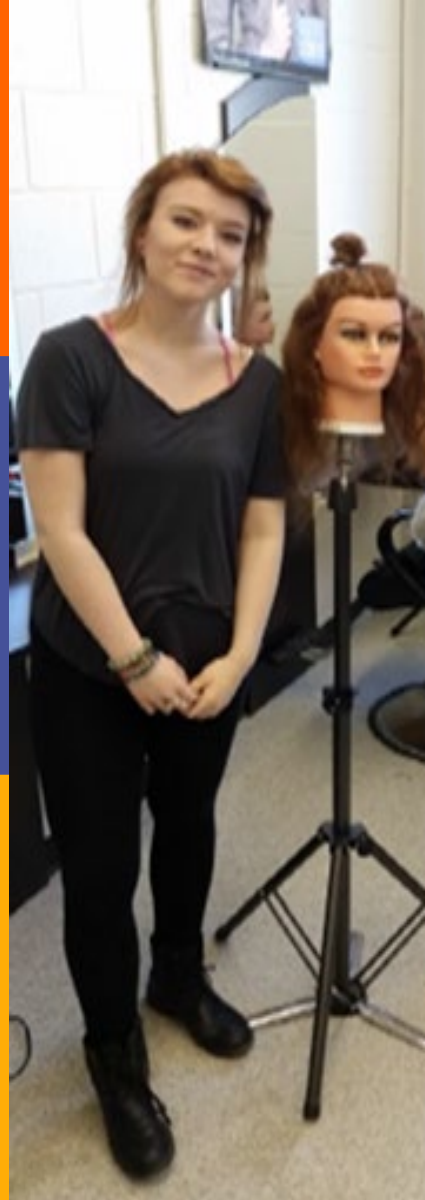

WORK EXPERIENCE

Work Experience

Students are able to receive credit in either **paid work** or **unpaid volunteer** work experience

All businesses must have an active WorksafeBC account in good standing.

WEX 12A (4 Credits) and WEX 12B (4 Credits)

Requires 120 hours of documented work & course work for each 4 credit course

Needs to be different task to get credit for both courses (or two different jobs)
