The Board of Education are incredibly thankful to our students, staff, and families for their continued support during the pandemic. Alignment:

The health and safety of students and staff in BC schools has been the focus of all K-12 partners throughout the three years of the COVID-19 pandemic and recovery.

A coordinated approach to health and safety guidelines and measures across the K-12 sector has been a key part of why School District 22 (Vernon) schools have remained open to provide in-person education to students.

The Board of Education has to date, and will continue to, fully support Health & Safety Measures including and not limited to encouraging everyone to:

- <u>Get vaccinated</u> (no mandate, yet strongly encouraged for all 5 and up). Since December, the Board has encouraged and supported all employees to be vaccinated. Since January, many new hires are submitting their vaccine passports as part of their application process.
- Complete a daily health check
- Stay home when sick
- Physically Distance
- Wash hands often
- Wear masks (no longer required beginning the first day of Spring Break and will remain a personal choice after this)

In addition, the Board of Education has fully supported all Provincial COVID-19 Communicable Disease Guidelines for K-12 Settings, as well as our own School District 22 Communicable Disease Guidelines (CDP).
