Nursing Unit Assistants are key members of the healthcare team, have frequent contact with nursing and medical staff, and perform a wide range of clerical duties related to the operation of a patient/resident care facility.

This program provides participants with the appropriate course work and practicum experience to function as a nursing unit assistant. Responsible for a variety of clerical duties, students will learn theory and application of relevant medical terminology to serve as this key member of the healthcare team.

Employment opportunities: Hospitals, medical offices, care facilities, health authorities and health service agencies.



Annual intakes run September - June, two evenings per week and most Saturdays

Program includes a 125-hour supervised practicum (at approved locations).

Dual Credit students receive credit in four SD 22 Grade 12 elective courses (16 credits total).
