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Career Pathway Programs

Students are enrolled in a program and earn high school elective credits.

Technology Sampler

The Technology Sampler will provide you with skills and knowledge related to the growing technology sector. Free for **grade 10 - 12 students** interested in technology and coding. Students will receive four credits for a grade 12 elective course.

Engineering Sampler

This program includes learning about different engineering classifications and industries, explore fundamental engineering principals, understand the design process, analyze different ways to solve problems and an introduction to systems, concepts, and applications within the engineering industry. Free for **grade 10 - 12 students** interested in engineering.

Trade Sampler

The 12-week, Trade Sampler Program is designed to provide students with both practical and theoretical experience in a wide variety of building trade sectors. Students will gain the first hand knowledge necessary to make an informed choice about a career in the trades. Students will learn practical skills and industry requirements for a variety of trades and also how to access training, apprenticeship, and employment. Free for **grade 10 - 12 students** interested in Trades.

Health Sampler

This sampler will provide students with an opportunity to explore a variety of high demand health care careers, sample job tasks and identify educational requirements for entry into the profession. Free for **grade 11 - 12 students** interested in the health care sector.

Work Experience

Would you like to get high school credits for the employment skills you are gaining in the workplace Students will need 110 hours to complete Work Experience. Work Experience (WEX 12A/WEX 12B) can count as credits for up to two full courses.

Work In Trades/Apprenticeships

Students can start the work-based training of their trade apprenticeship while they are still in high school. Students must be employed (paid) in an apprenticeable trade. Most students' work does not interfere with their school day. Students can earn 16 credits towards their high school diploma and 480 hours towards their trade credential.

Forestry Trades Program

Three days a week, students are outside at Woodlot 1908 experiencing and learning about important skills and characteristics sought by many employers in industries from; forestry, mining, construction, oil and gas, and road building. Students learn about critical team skills, safety, work ethic, initiative, reliability, problem-solving, respect, confidence, and character building. These valuable skills focus on future employment no matter what field. Grade 11 and 12 students.

Jean Minguy Memorial RCMP Youth Academy

Students who are interested in pursuing a career in law enforcement will get a very good insight in the training and demands placed on police officers. This Academy runs in May from Sunday to Friday for 6 days. Students will be personally challenged in their leadership abilities, physical abilities, and mental toughness.

BC Wildfire - Jr. Fire Crew

Every summer the Vernon Fire Zone hires students from grade 12 to work with them for the season. It's an opportunity for students to learn what it takes to be a wildland firefighter in BC. They will spend every day training, working as part of a team on work projects, and responding to wildland fires with their crews.
